Stu and I set off today (4th January 2010) from La Gomera in the Canary Islands. The race has been delayed by 1 month because of bad weather - and we've just heard that there may be some more on the way(!!) - but we have a sufficient enough window to make hay while the sun shines - so bring it on!

The Atlantic Ocean, from San Sebastian de La Gomera to English Harbour (Antigua) is 2550 nautical miles (nm) as the crow flies, but what with currents, wind, adverse conditions et al, we'll probably row between 2700nm - 3100nm. Lets hope it's the former!!!
